

## Flows continue in Iowa, Michigan. Sourwood ending in Southeast.

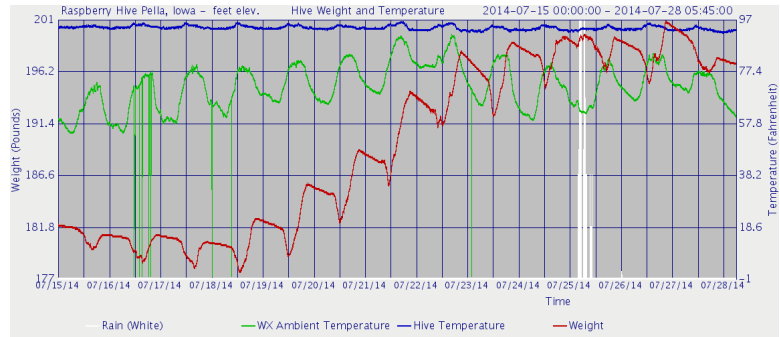
Raspberry Hive, in Pella, Iowa, USA gained over 20 lbs. in the last 10 days. This flow appears to be over.

Matt, in Portland, Michigan, USA gained about 40 lbs. Matt reports: Basswood, which is big around here, is probably about done for the season. Star thistle is spotty in our area. There are many wildflowers in bloom right now. Definitely plenty of sources out there the last several weeks.

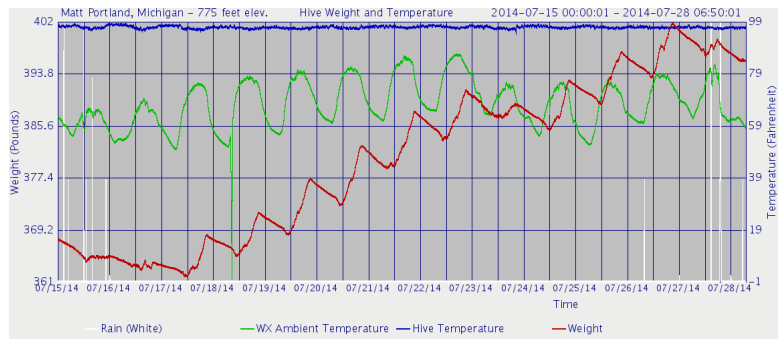

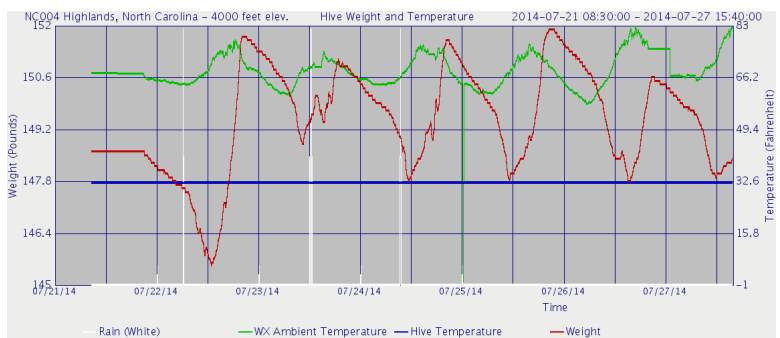
Daily sourwood flows of 2 to 3 lbs continue in the higher elevations (NC004) but in the valleys (XP001), it is over. Evaporation loss at XP001 has leveled out, possibly indicating the honey moisture content is low enough to harvest.



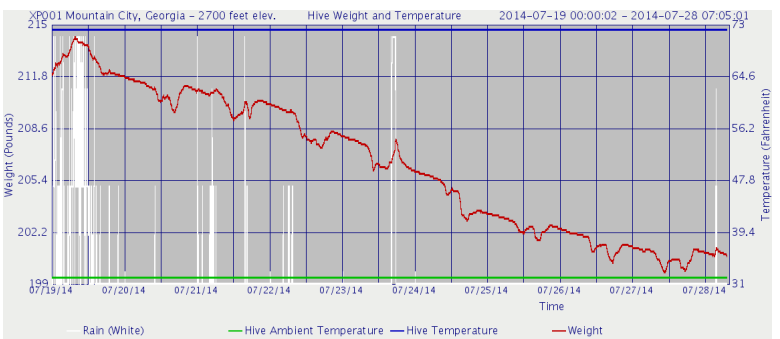
**Graph 1: Raspberry Hive, Pella, IA gained over 20 lbs.**
