

Flows slow in soggy South. Hives gain weight in Minnesota and California.

As can be seen in Illustration 1, most of the southeastern US received two to four inches of rain this last week, with some areas receiving four to six inches.

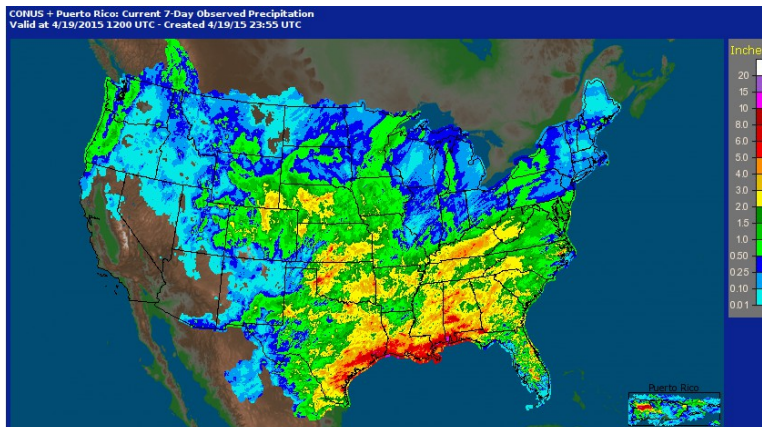
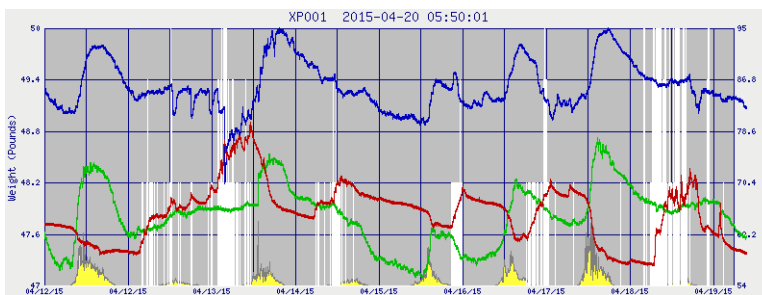


Illustration 1: Cumulative rainfall amounts for last 7 days.

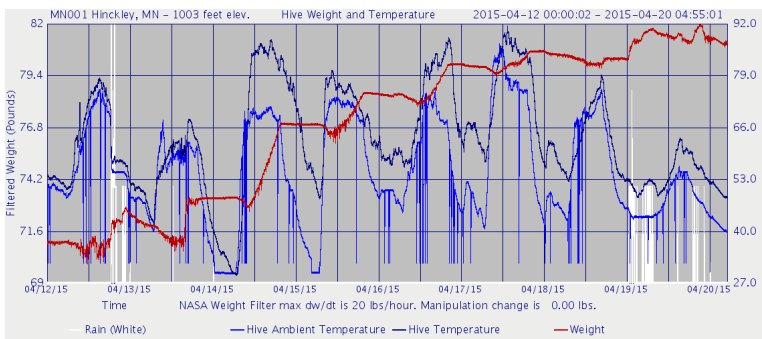
The result of a week of rain can be seen in Graph 1 of XP001 in northeast Georgia where any weight gains were probably water and the hive ended the week with about the same weight.



Graph 1: XP001, Mountain City, GA USA

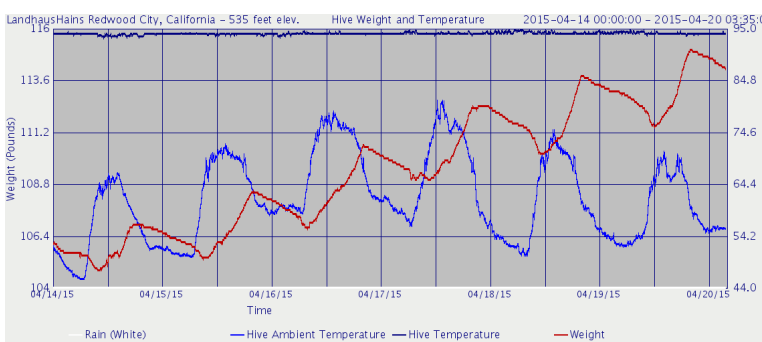
Two bright spots were Minnesota and California.
